



## **Galhampton Village Hall Emergency Plan 2024 - 25**

### Introduction

All major emergencies are dealt with by the emergency services, Local Authorities, Utilities and voluntary agencies in a combined response. In extreme circumstances such as heavy snow, flooding, and storm damage there is a possibility that the emergency services may not be able to reach the scene immediately.

Galhampton Village Hall is located on Long Street, Galhampton BA22 7AY

### Facilities

The main hall is 20m by 10m and is capable of housing approx. 80 people. In addition, there is a further meeting room and a private office. The hall has a kitchen with full cooking facilities along with toilets including disabled access. The hall is Wi-Fi enabled along with a projection and sound system.

The carpark is small but capable of holding up to 10 cars.

There are two defibrillators located in Galhampton. One located at the village church and the second outside the main entrance to the village hall.

The hall has a container which houses items such as a generator, gazebos, external lighting and tables and chairs all available for use.
